The Librarian's Report. 1895/1896

Apart from the Hopkins - collection the most considerable gift yet made to us has been the literary apparatus of the late Prof. Rudolf Hildebrand of Leipzig.

Through the efforts of Dr. Julius Goebel friends of the University contributed funds for the purchase of this collection and have it presented the University Library.

During the past year (1895) it has been entered in the Library accession book and a rough author catalog made.

The collection has thus been found to consist of
