To travellers extending their tours to countries where an other language is prevalent, or wishing to converse with tourists that speak a foreign language, I recommend my Dictionaries: "German-French" and "French-German", 1 vol. № 2.25, "German-Italian" and "Italian-German", 1 vol. № 3.—, "German-English" and "English-German" 1 vol. № 3.—.
