 by the nobleman Robert Fitz
 Stephen who was the first

 by the nobleman John de
 St. John who was the
 second Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King Edward the Third.
 The church was again
 rebuilt in the year 1550
 by the nobleman Thomas
 de St. John who was the
 third Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King Edward the Sixth.
 The church was again
 rebuilt in the year 1650
 by the nobleman John de
 St. John who was the
 fourth Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King Charles the Second.
 The church was again
 rebuilt in the year 1750
 by the nobleman John de
 St. John who was the
 fifth Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King George the Third.
 The church was again
 rebuilt in the year 1850
 by the nobleman John de
 St. John who was the
 sixth Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King George the Fourth.
 The church was again
 rebuilt in the year 1950
 by the nobleman John de
 St. John who was the
 seventh Baron of the
 Exchequer in the reign
 of King George the Fifth.
