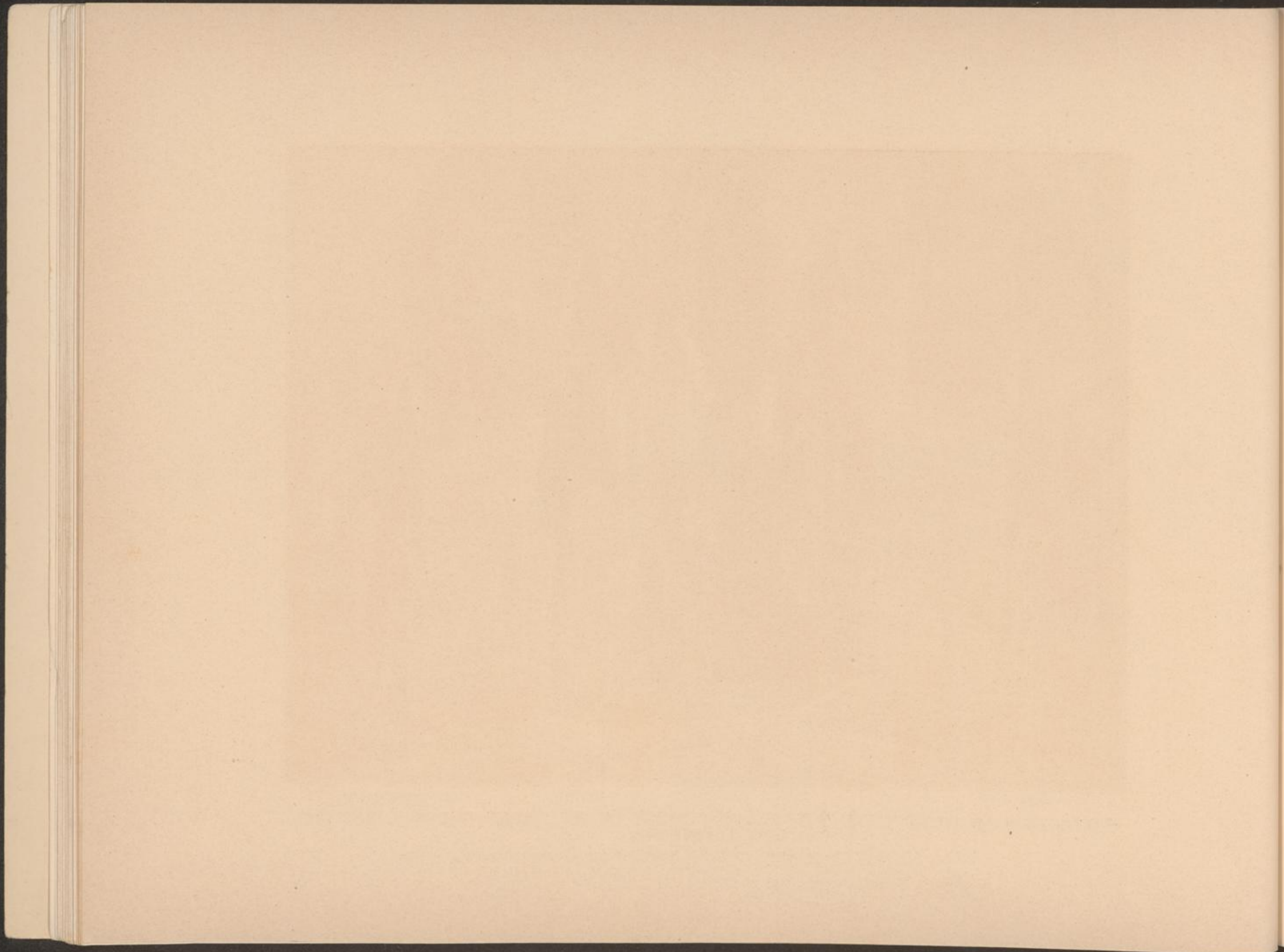

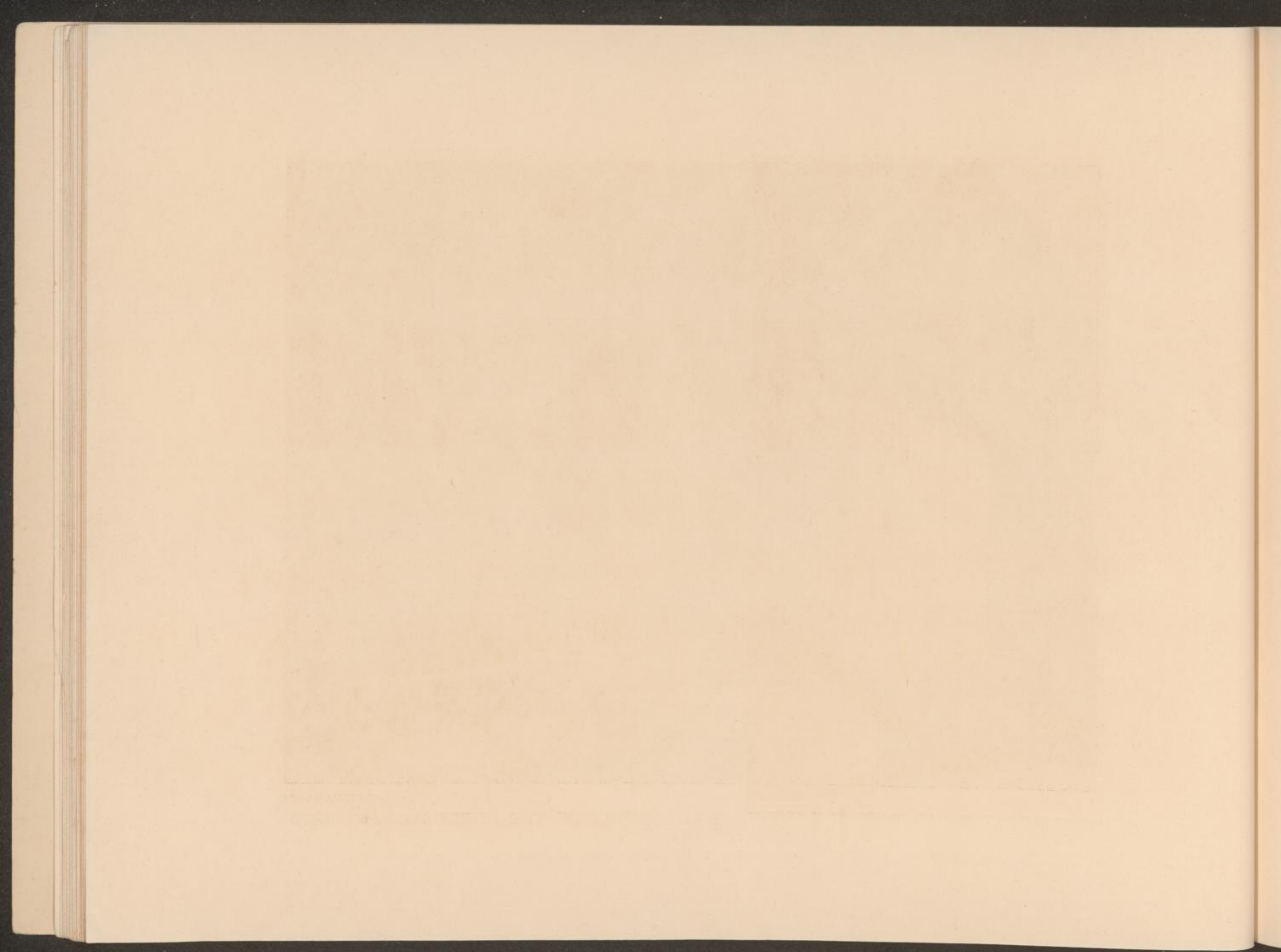

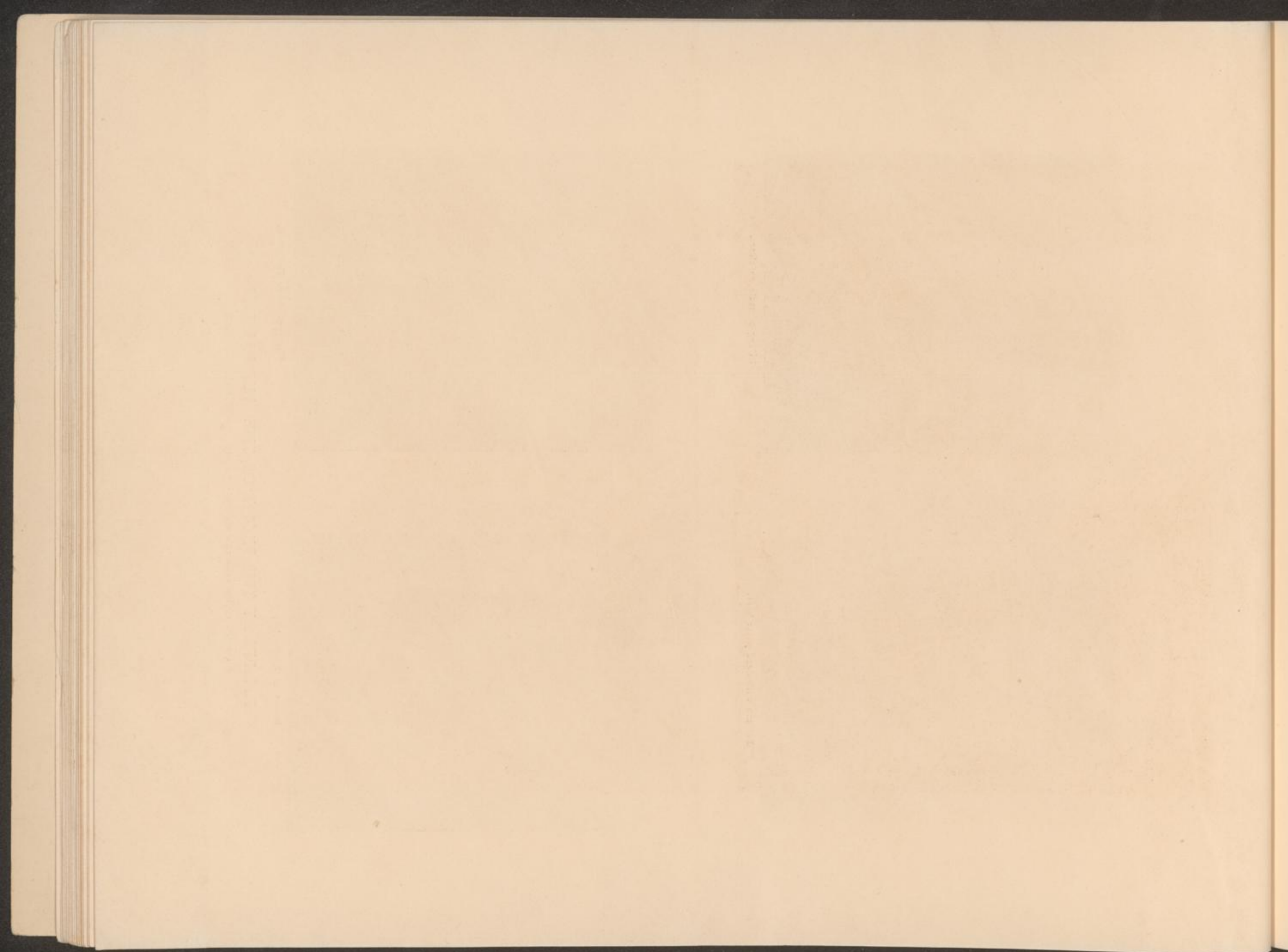

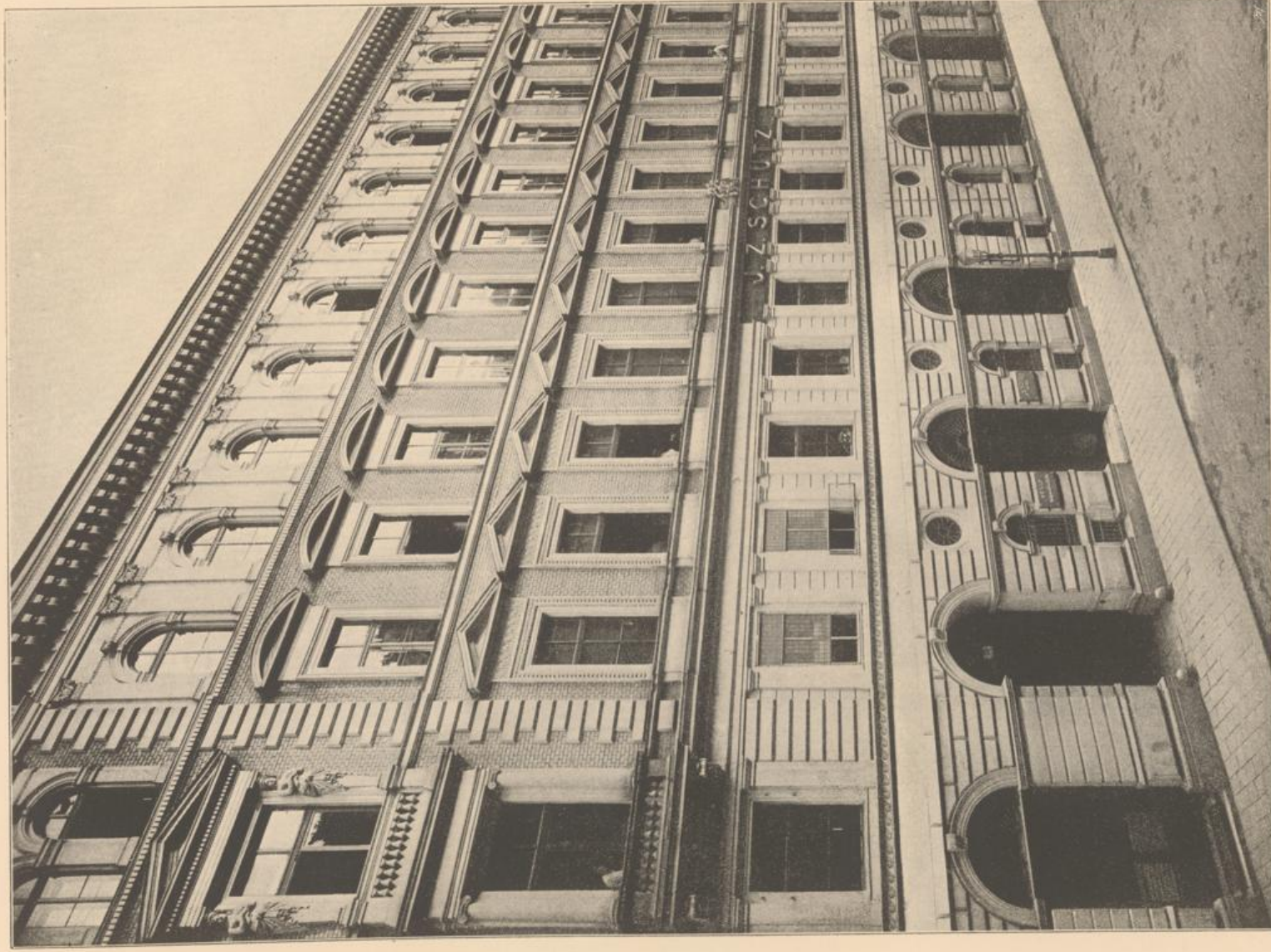

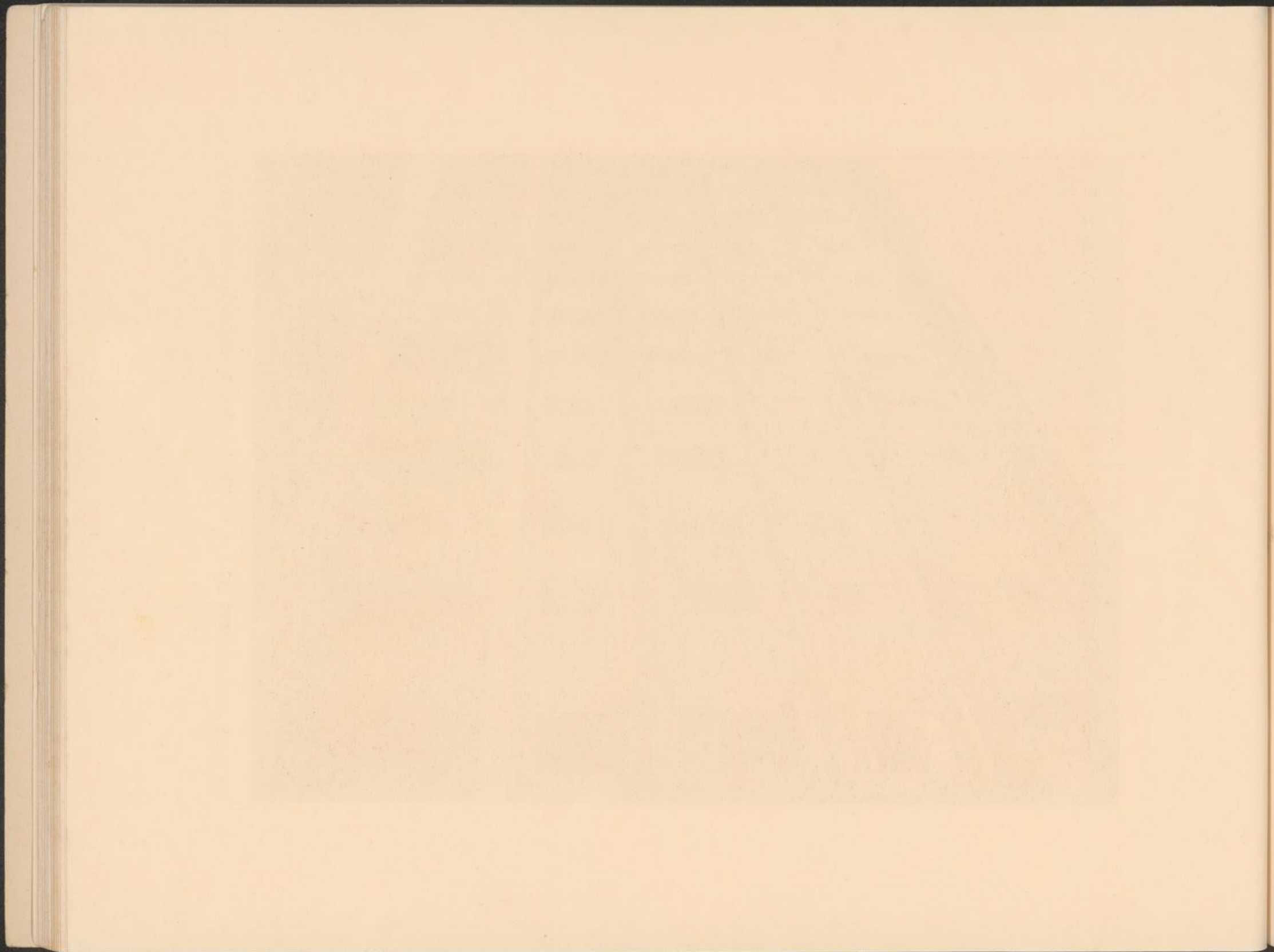

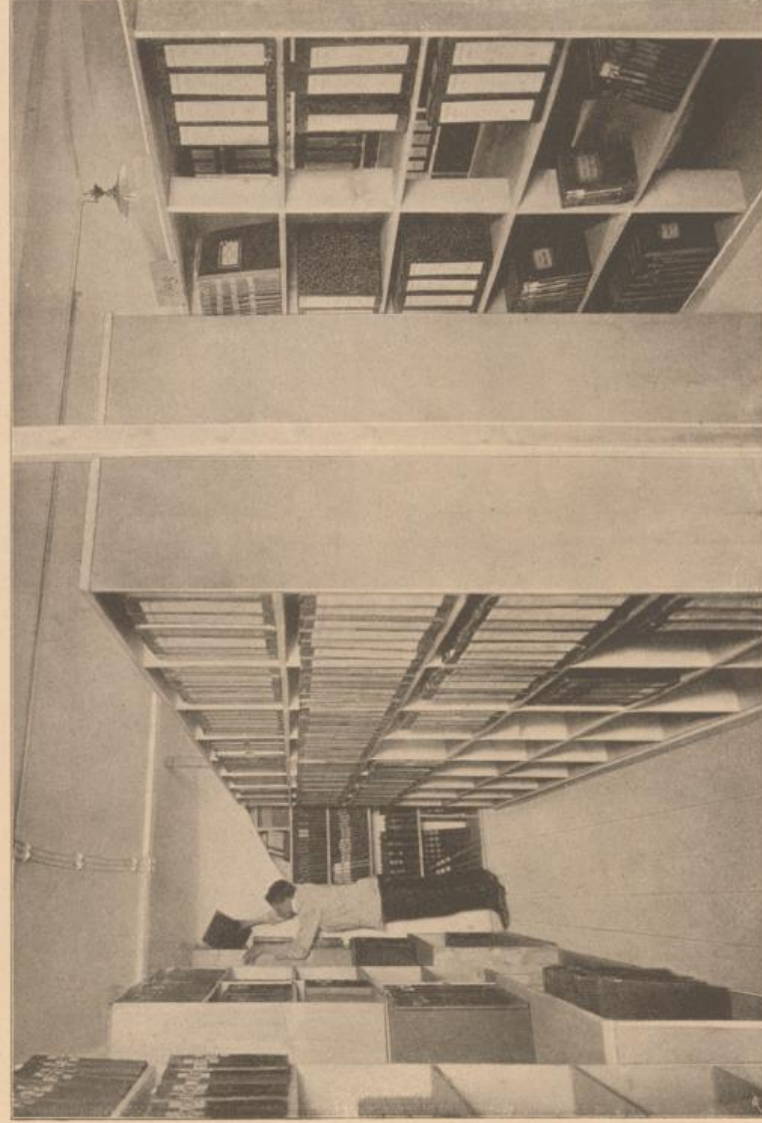




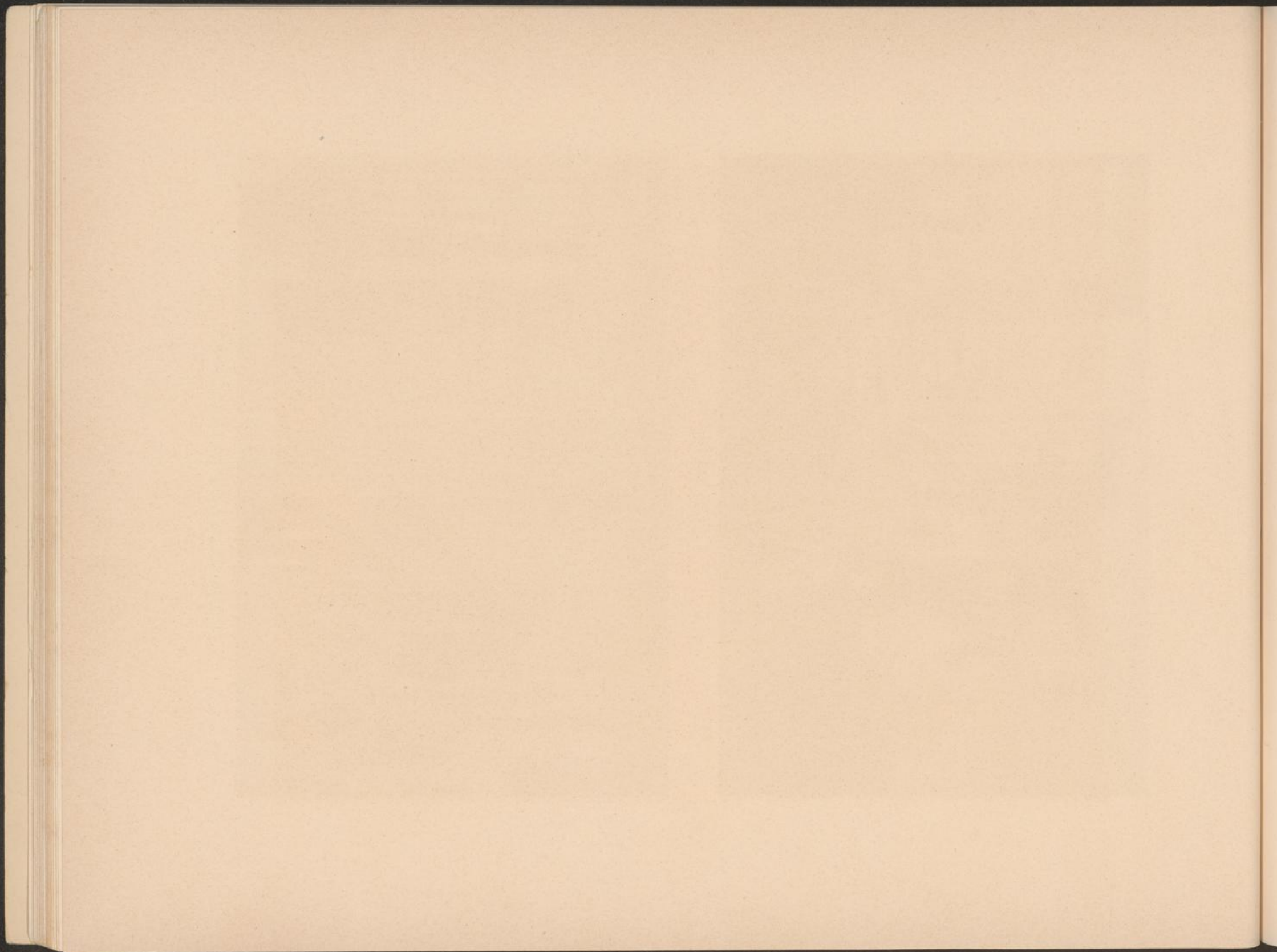

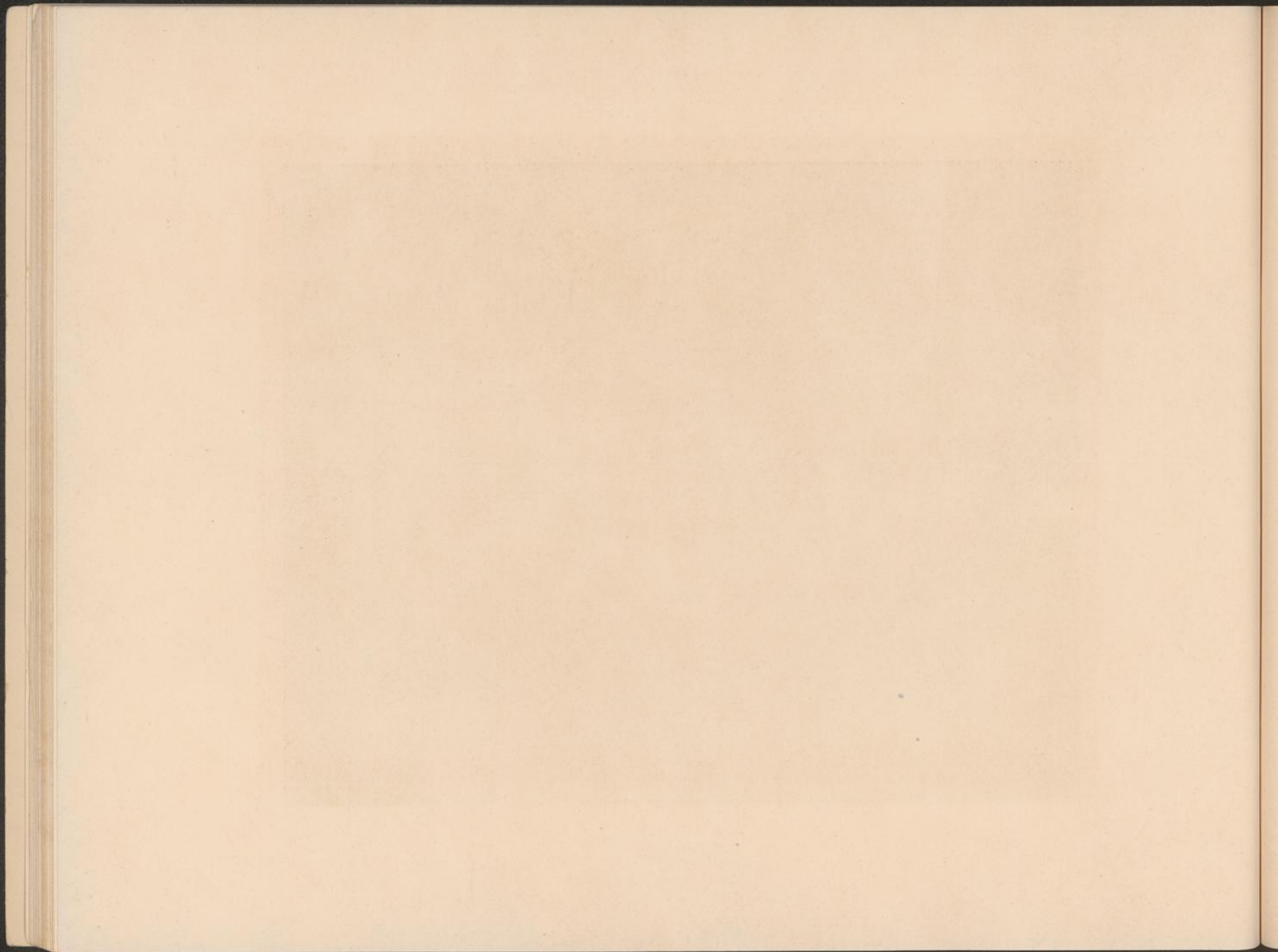

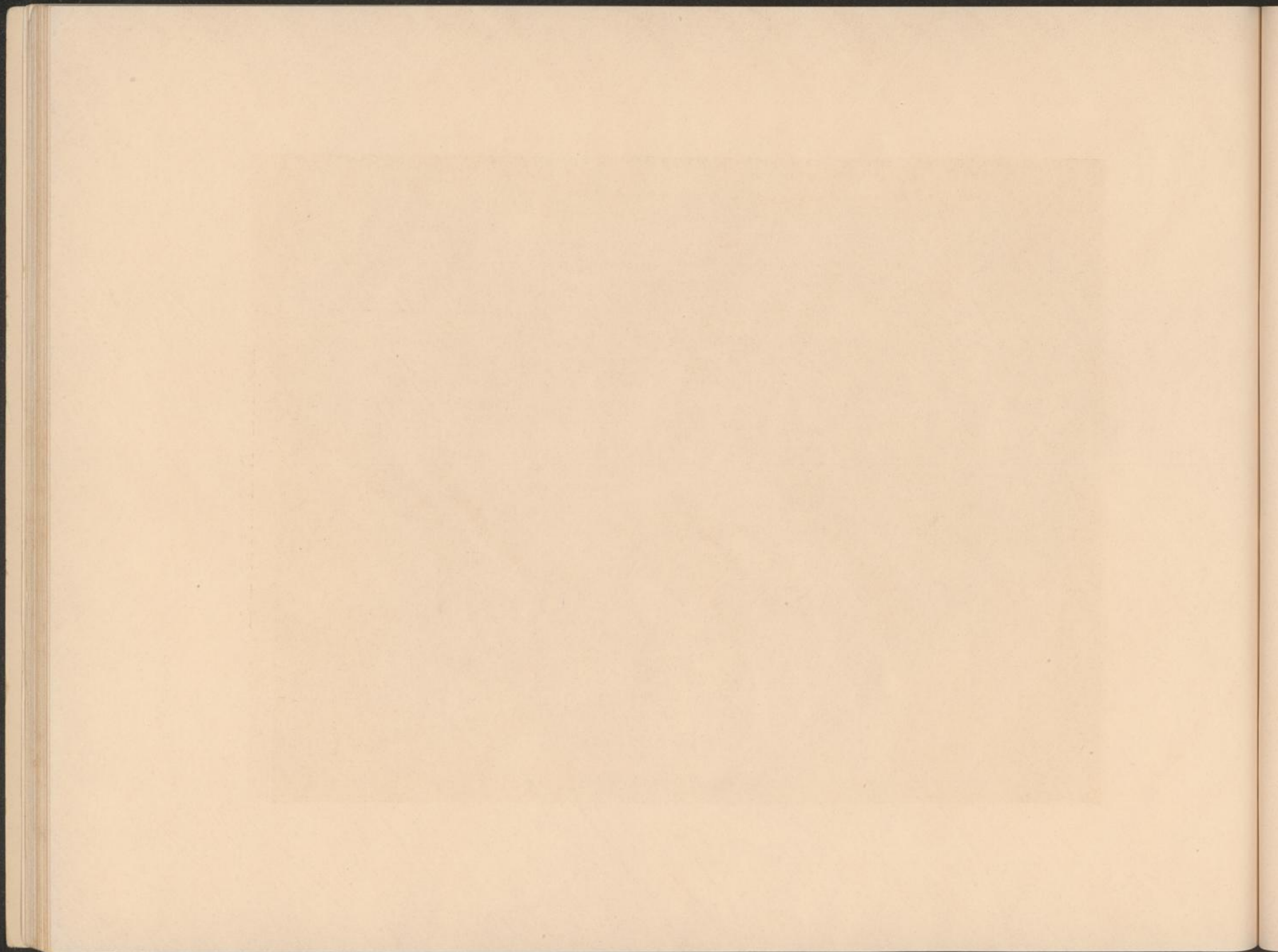


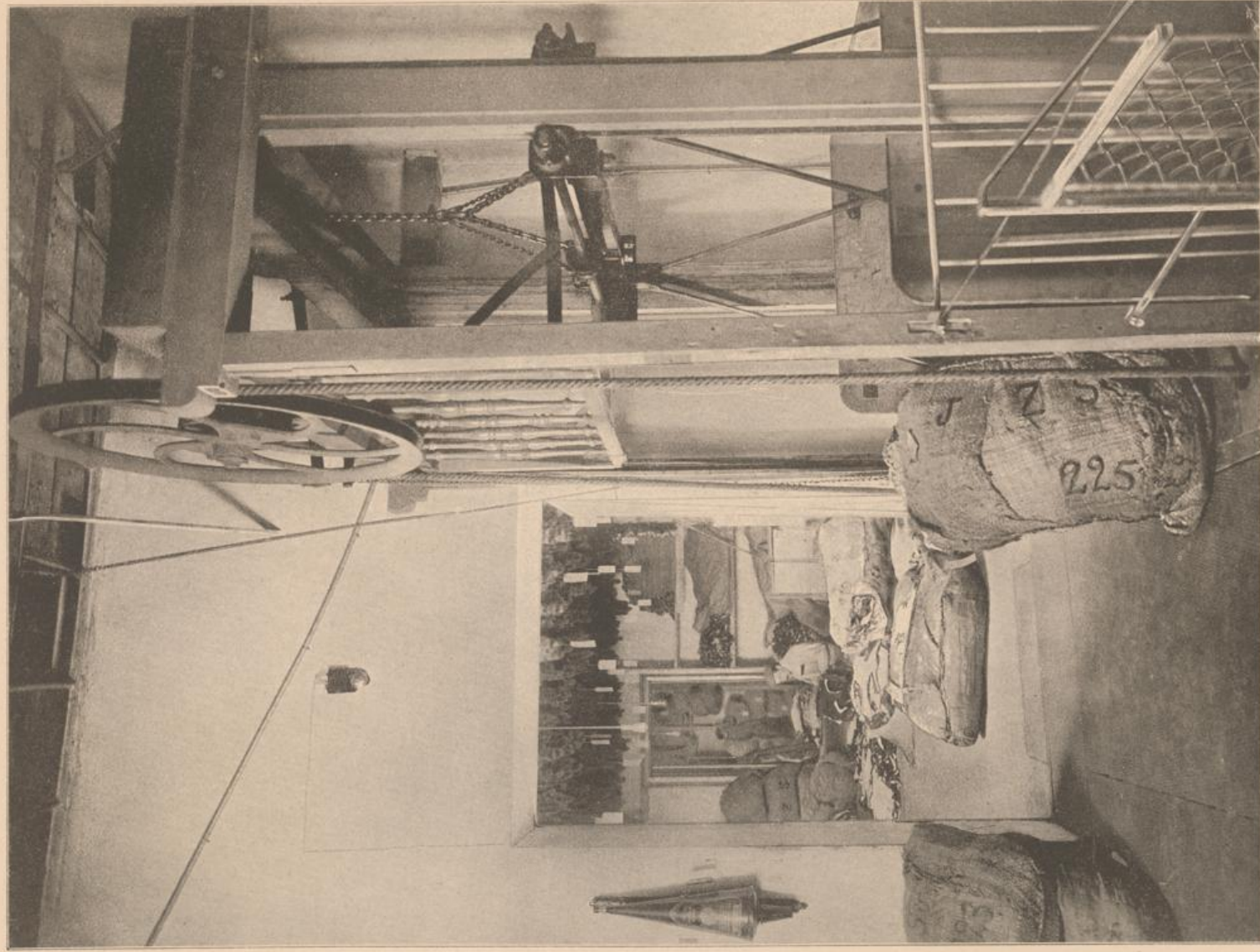

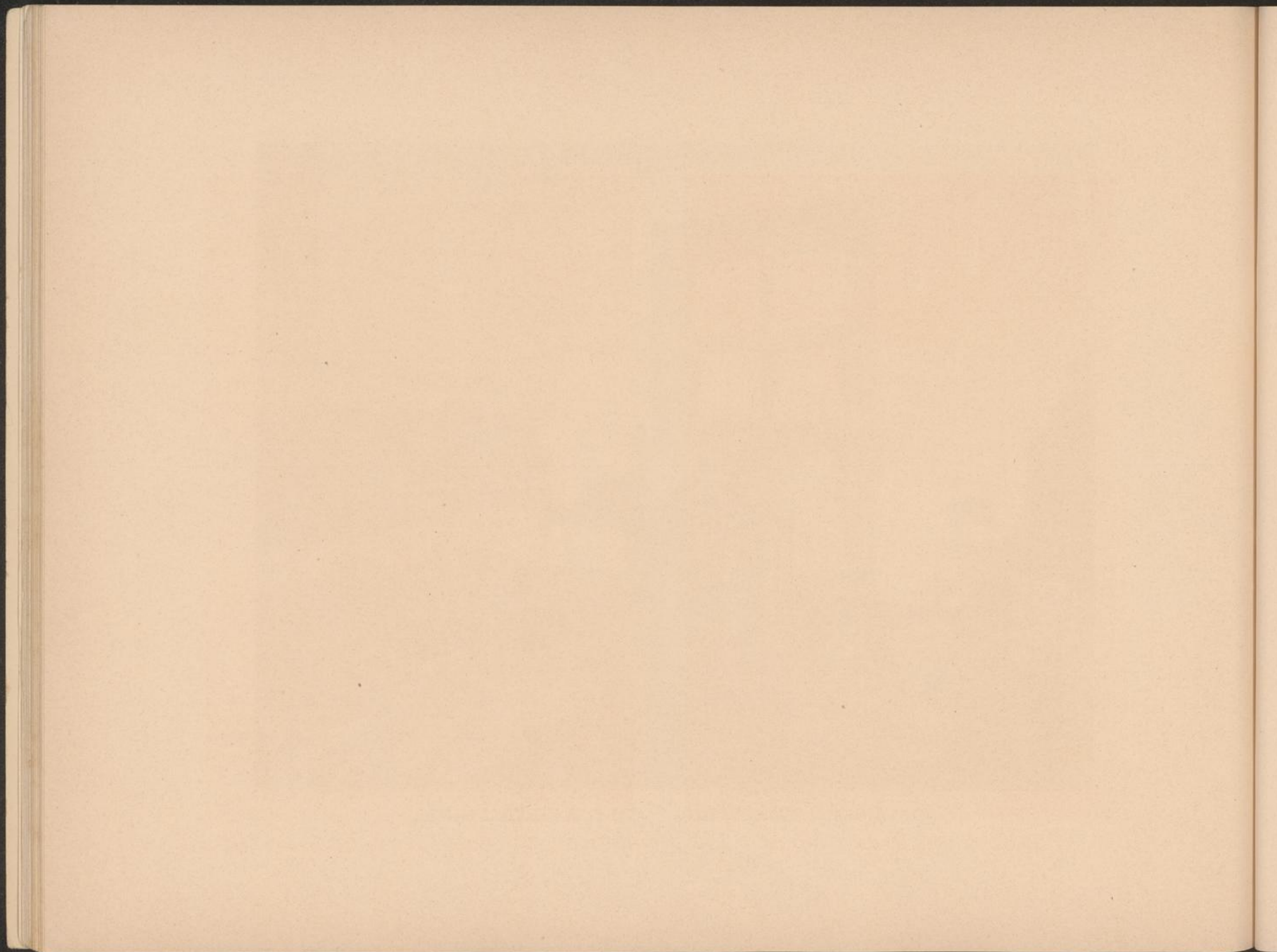




PART OF THE RAW PERSIAN LAMBS STOCK.

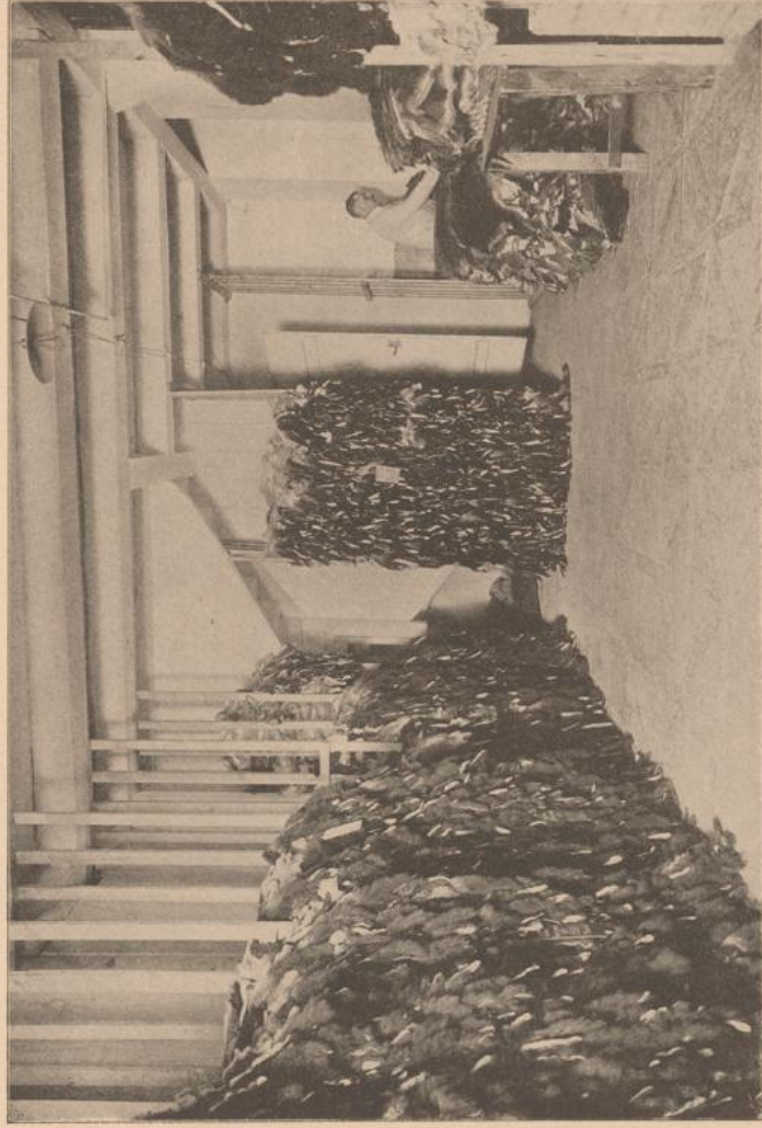

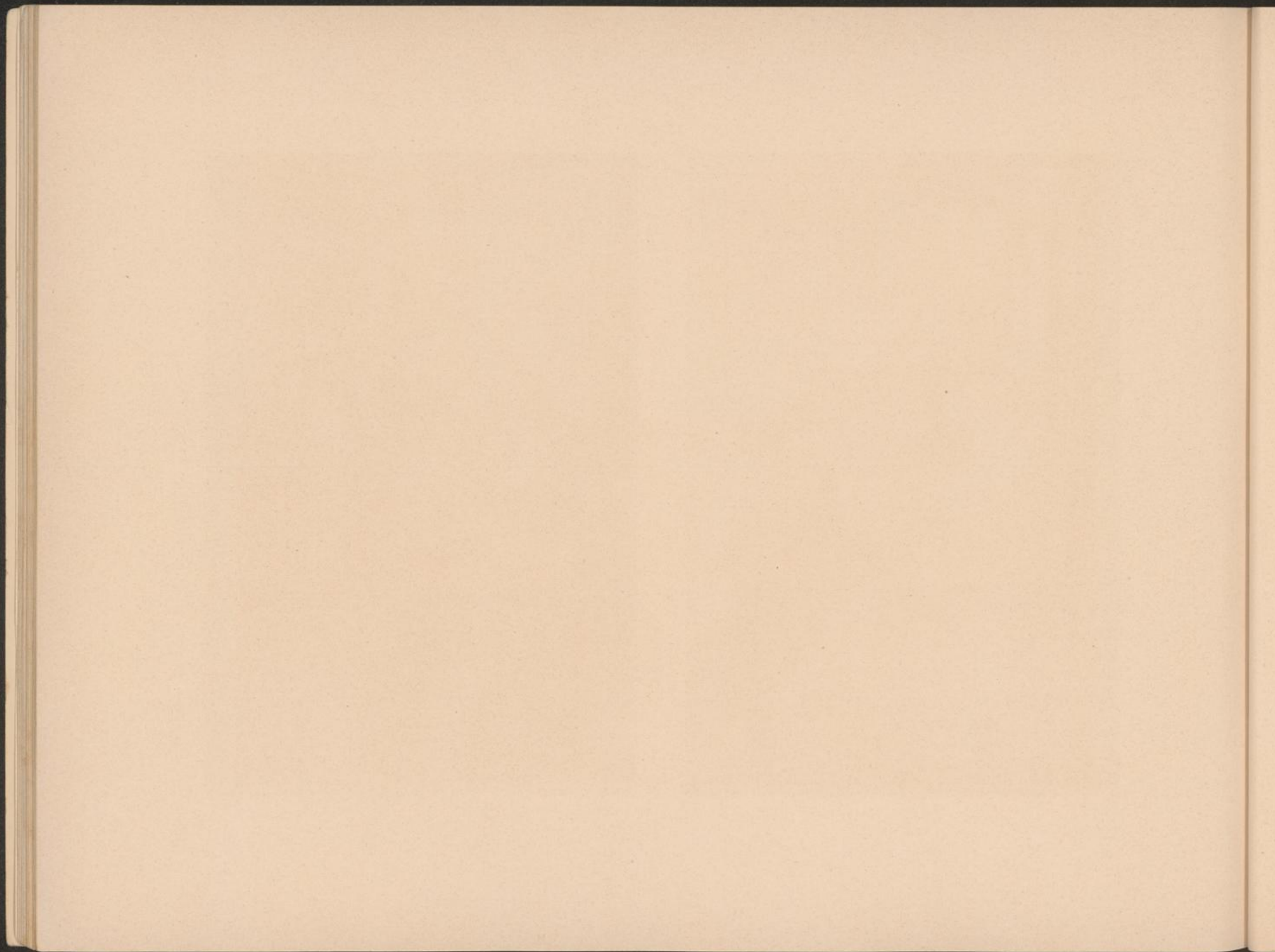

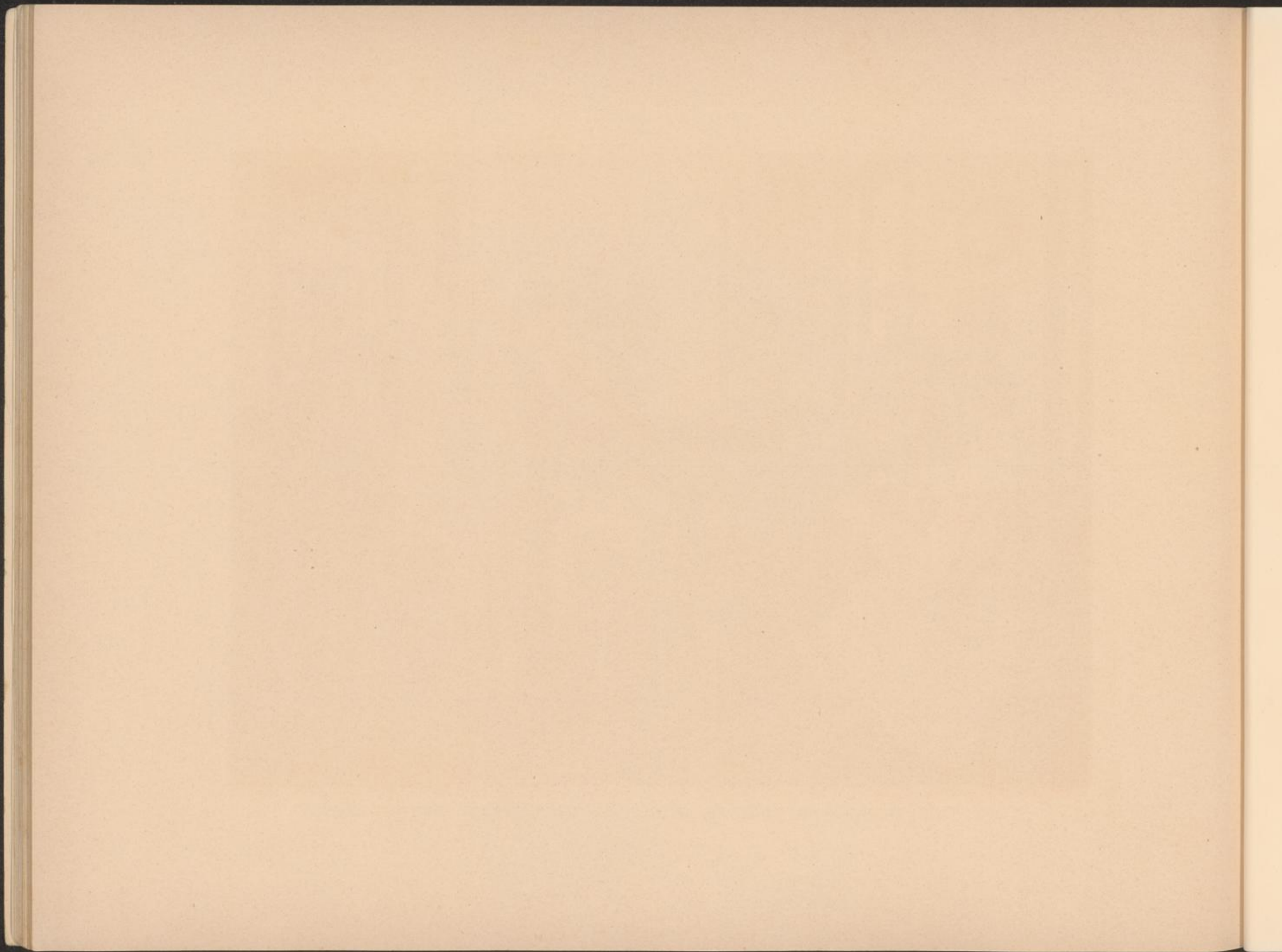

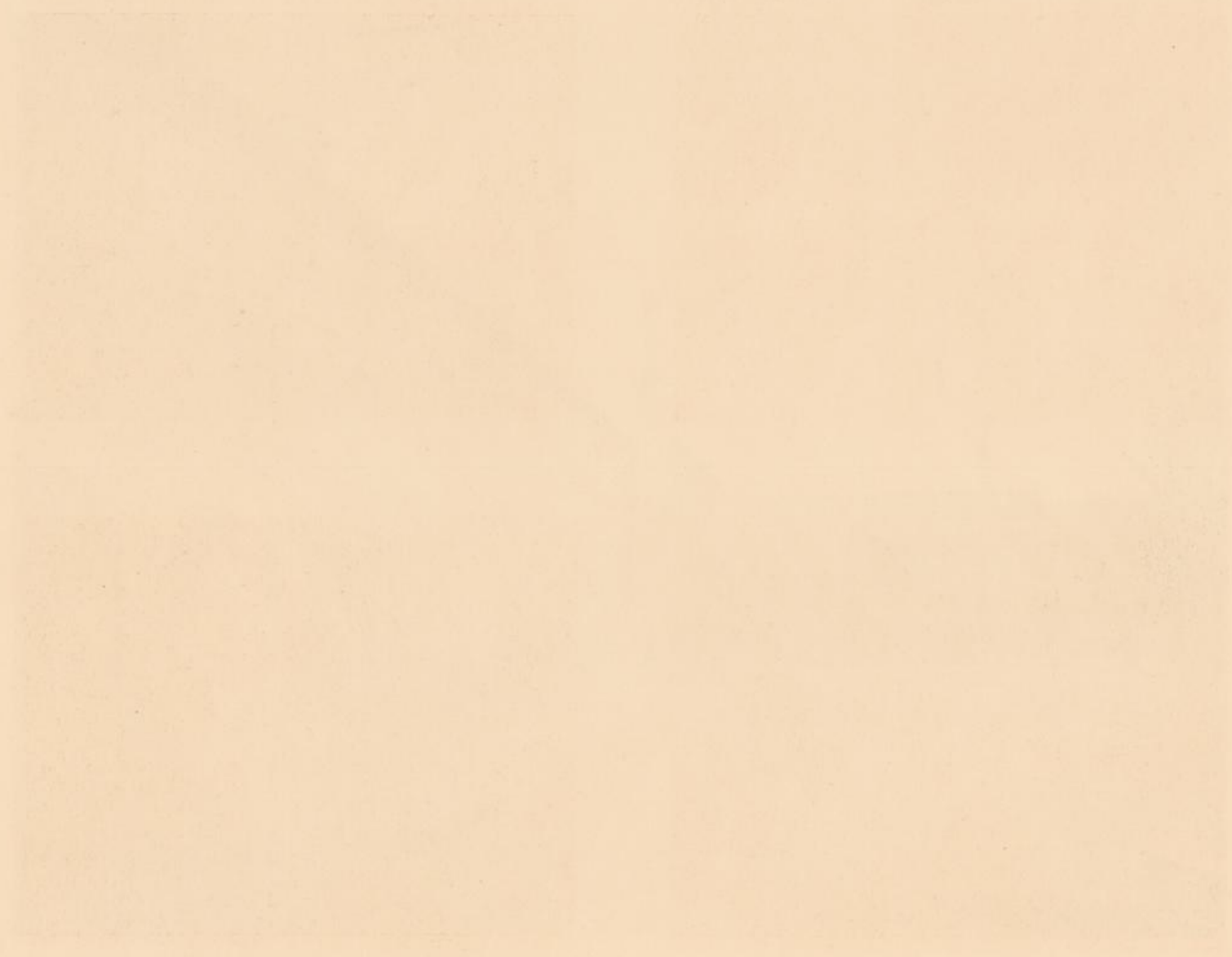

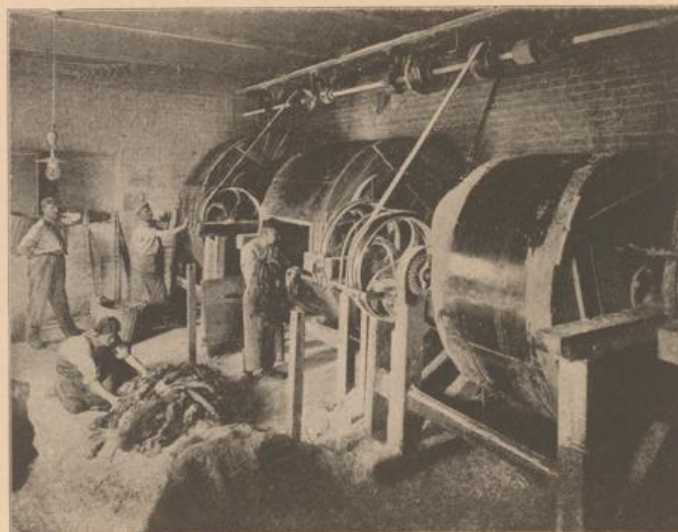




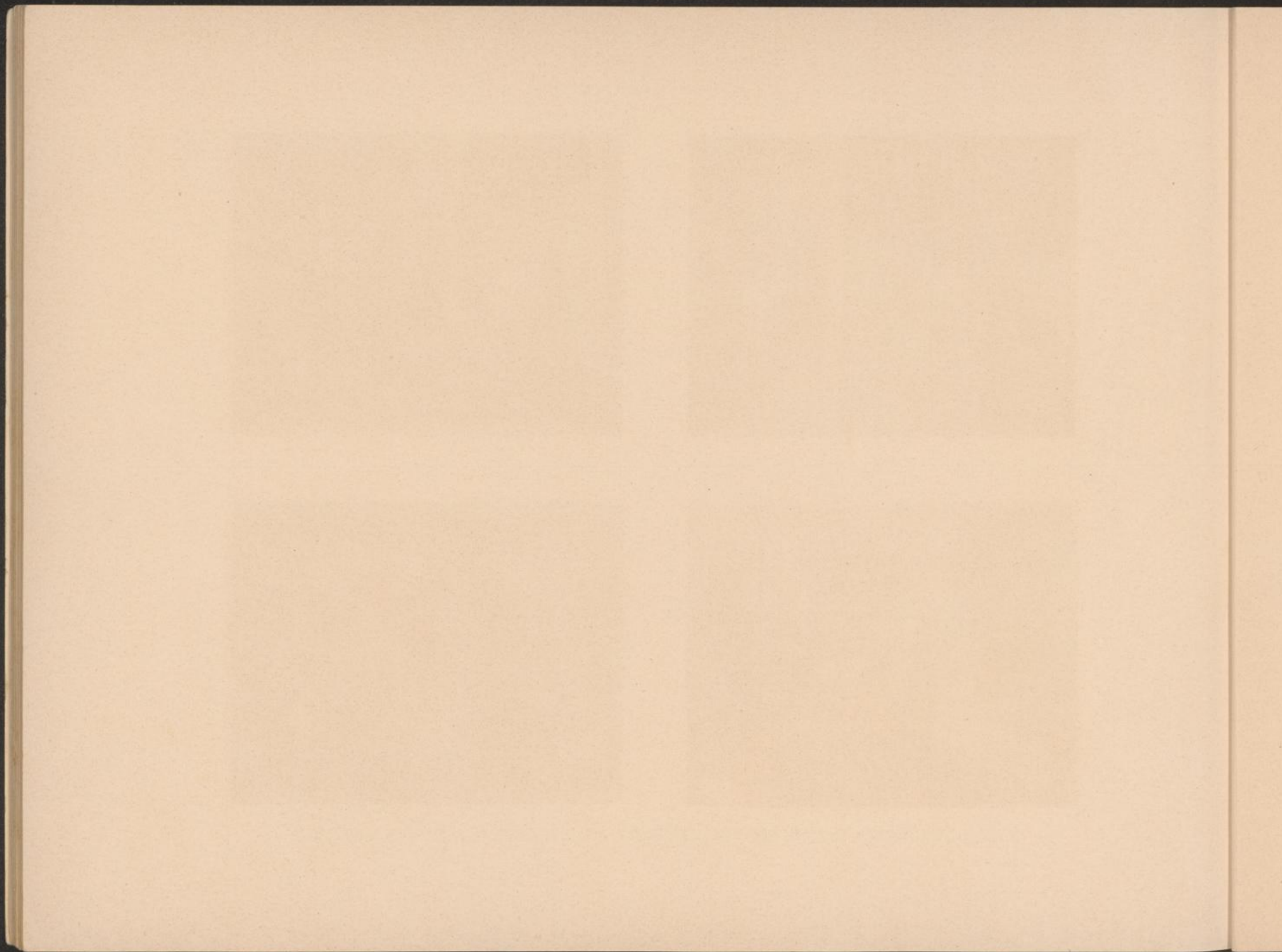

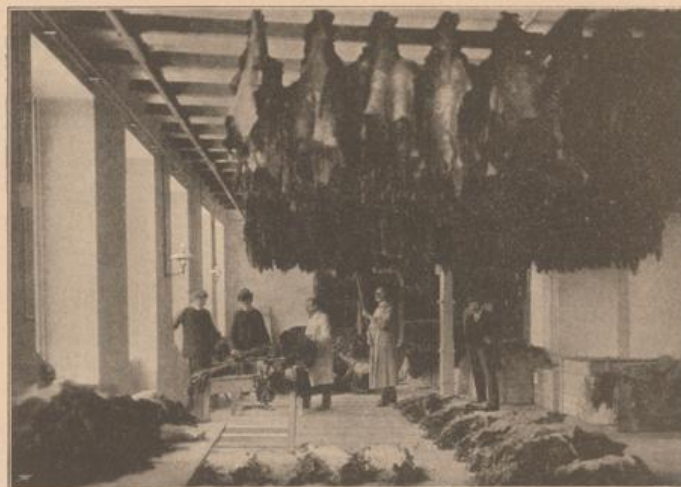

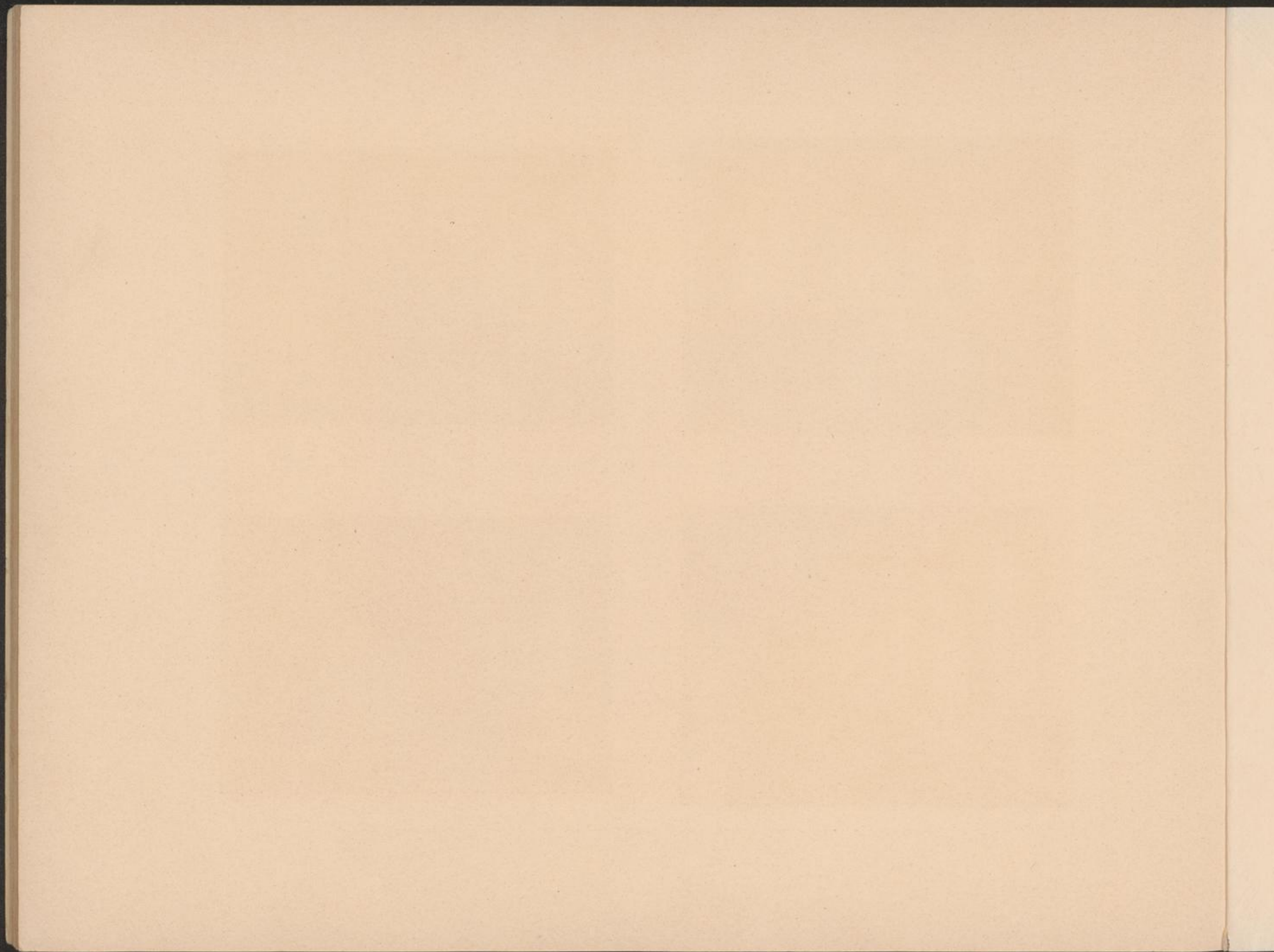


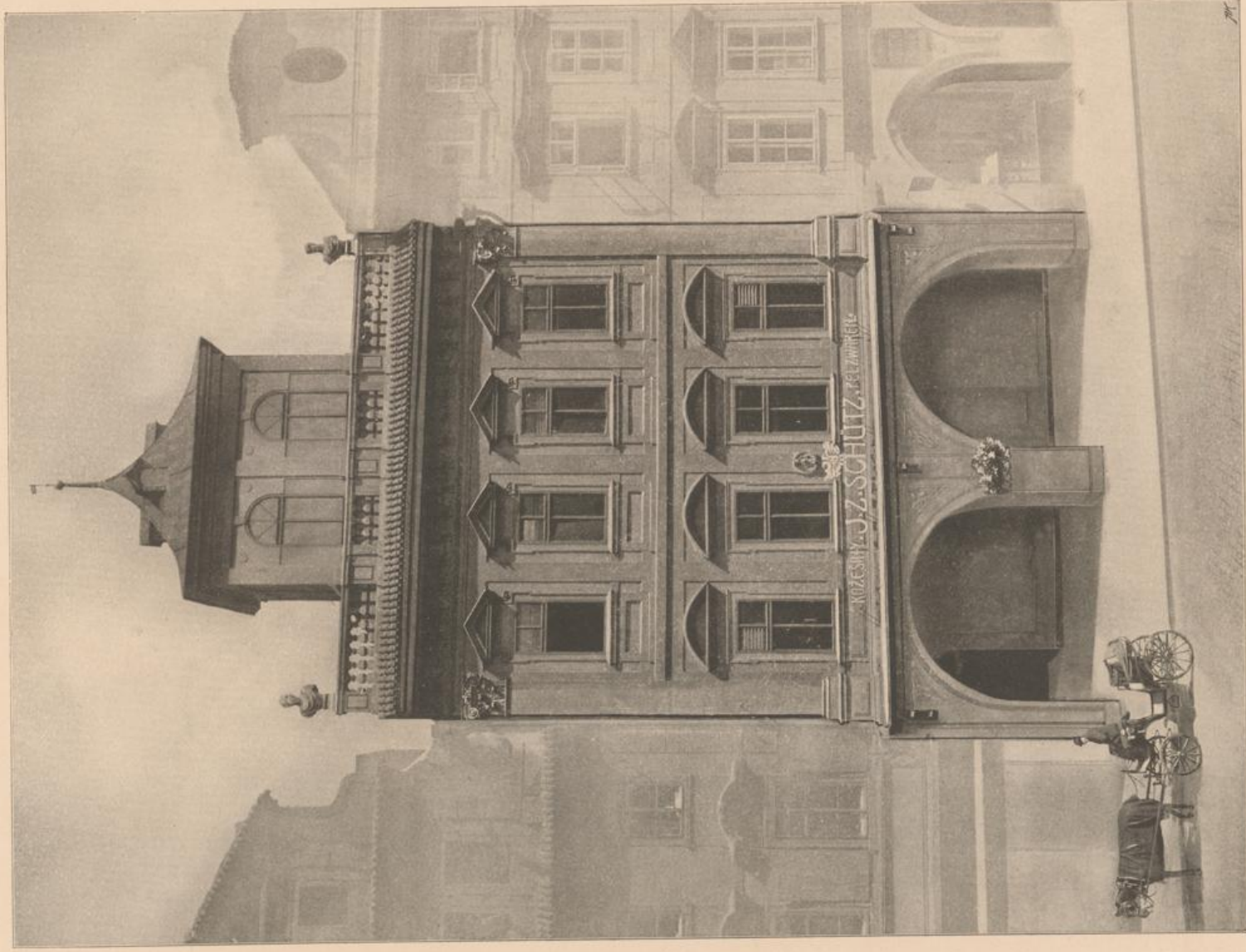
