The Views of the Principal Towns are from drawings made on the spot, and engraved expressly for this edition. The Map of Germany is on a large scale, and the Roads are accurately delineated. The Plan of Vienna, as well as that of Berlin, is from the most correct Survey.

This work has been preceded by the publication of Reichard's Itineraries of France, Belgium, and Italy, which have met with great encouragement from a liberal Public.

The distances are calculated in German miles, which are nearly equal to three English miles. The Itinerary of Hungary and Turkey has been added to the work, as it was not found sufficiently extensive to form a separate volume.
